

The following is a sample of the Level 3-5 Kaupapa Hauora and Tikanga Hauora standards and is an example of the range of Hauora standards that are available in Field Māori. These standards are available for use by providers, schools and kura who have consent to assess.

Kaupapa Hauora

Level 3

15310 Demonstrate knowledge of the human life course in a hauora context 4 credits

Level 4

18561 Compile a database of hauora service providers, and identify and explain referral policies and processes 4 credits

Level 5

15311 Relate Māori mana motuhake to working in hauora 4 credits

Tikanga Hauora

Level 3

18363 Explain and apply tikanga associated with hauora in the home 4 credits

Level 4

15308 Demonstrate knowledge of stress management methods in a hauora context 4 credits

15314 Explain and apply tikanga when communicating with, and caring for, whānau in a hauora context 3 credits

15316 Explain, apply and maintain personal and professional boundaries when working with whānau 3 credits

Overview

Te Tuapapa Hei Whai i te Ao Marama (Kaupae 4) [Ref:2880]

New Zealand Certificate in the Care and Enabling of Disabled Tangata Māori (Level 4) [Ref: 2880]

The purpose of this qualification is to provide whānau, hapū, iwi, hapori and disability, health, and social service providers with people who are able to apply Māori models of whānau-centred practice in the care and enabling of disabled tangata Māori and their whānau. Under broad guidance they will self-manage their learning and performance and assume some responsibility for the performance of others.

This qualification provides a formal learning pathway for people already working with tangata Māori with disabilities and their whānau or people considering employment in this area.

Graduates of this qualification will demonstrate an understanding and knowledge of the delivery of disability, health, and social services to disabled tangata Māori and their whānau, based on Māori models of whānau-centred practice.

Education Pathways

Subject to prerequisites, students may continue their Hauora study to a Level 5 qualification, including:

- New Zealand Certificate in Whānau Ora (Level 5) [Ref: 2879]
- Te Pou Tautoko i te Ora (Kaupae 5) [Ref: 2876]
- New Zealand Certificate in Kaupapa Māori Public Health (Level 5) [Ref: 2871]
- New Zealand Certificate in Public Health and Health Promotion (Level 5) [Ref: 1865].

Career Opportunities

This qualification provides a pathway for those seeking to work effectively in Māori communities amongst whānau, hapū, and/or iwi.

Graduates of the certificate will have the transferable skills and knowledge to potentially secure the following roles:

- Disability enabling worker
- Community worker
- Plunket kaiāwhina
- Hauora navigator
- Whānau Ora practitioner
- Social work assistant
- Teacher aide
- Kaumātua enabling worker
- Voluntary enabling worker.

They will also be equipped to contribute to the needs and aspirations of disabled tangata Māori and their whānau by undertaking roles for whānau, hapū, iwi, and relevant community based organisations that contribute to the development and awareness of Māori disability, health, and social sector services.

Review of Unit Standards

The Hauora Levels 5 and 6 unit standards are currently being reviewed to align the outcomes of the standards with the newly listed New Zealand qualifications. If you would like further information in regards to the unit standards, please contact Māori Qualification Services.
