## Overview

### Te Hiringa o Te Taiao (Kaupae 4) [Ref: 2346]

*New Zealand Certificate in Māori Environment Practices (Level 4)*

This qualification is intended for whānau, hapū, iwi and others with some experience in mātauranga Taiao, or those intending to work in the area of tiaki Taiao, and who are seeking a formal qualification to work independently at an intermediate level.

Graduates of this qualification will understand the value of mātauranga Taiao and will be able to use their skills and knowledge based on whanaungatanga, kaitiakitanga, te pono me te tika, tūrangawaewae, pūkengatanga, and rangatiratanga to work independently to contribute to the future care and development of te Taiao for whānau, hapū, iwi and the community.

### Rūmakihia Te Taiao (Kaupae 6) [Ref: 2347]

*New Zealand Diploma in Māori Environment Management (Level 6)*

This qualification is for whānau, hapū, iwi, and others with knowledge and experience in mātauranga Taiao and/or working experience in environmental/resource management.

As managerial kaitiaki, graduates of this qualification will be able to lead and facilitate the design, development, implementation, and assessment and review of specialised and theoretical Taiao projects to maintain and enhance te Taiao for current and future generations.

## Career Opportunities

These qualifications provide a pathway for graduates to support the development of whānau, hapū, iwi/community capability/capacity to preserve, nurture and enrich mātauranga Taiao for current and future generations.

Graduates of the **certificate** will have the transferable skills and knowledge to contribute to future Taiao development of whānau, hapū, iwi, and community, and to act effectively across a range of roles including the following:

- Hapū and Iwi Environmental/Conservation roles
- Department of Conservation/Parks/Reserves Rangers
- Ngā Whenua Rāhui workers
- Nature Guides, Conservation/Environmental educational roles
- Other Conservation/Environmental contracting, or consultancy roles

Graduates of the **diploma** will have the transferable skills and knowledge to undertake a range of Māori and general environmental/resource management roles including the following:

- Hapū and Iwi Environmental/Conservation supervisor roles
- Department of Conservation/Parks/Reserves Senior Rangers
- Ngā Whenua Rāhui supervisory roles
- Conservation/Environmental contractor or consultancy management roles.
