Overview

New Zealand Certificate in Manaaki Marae – Te Kāuta, Te Wharekai (Level 2) [Ref: 2435]

- Foundation qualification for people considering roles in marae-based services (especially the whare kai) and/or the hospitality industry.
- Recognises basic kitchen skills, developed in a kaupapa/ wharekai context.
- Includes te reo; tikanga; karakia and waiata; marae roles; health, safety and hygiene; and basic cookery.
- May also provide pathway to the Level 3 Certificate in Cookery.

New Zealand Certificate in Manaaki Marae – Te Nihowera, Te Ringawera (Level 3) [Ref: 2434]

- For people looking to gain skills and knowledge in wharekai, and/or the hospitality industry.
- Recognises kitchen skills, including some responsibility for food preparation and cooking, developed in a kaupapa/ wharekai context.
- Includes te reo; tikanga; karakia and waiata; kai Māori; whanaungatanga and mahi tahu; health, safety and hygiene; and cooking.

New Zealand Certificate in Manaaki Marae – Whāngai Tāngata (Level 4) [Ref: 2433]

- For people furthering their skills and knowledge in the hospitality industry, with a focus on cooking complex dishes, and an introduction to team leadership.
- Recognises specialised kitchen skills, developed in a kaupapa/ wharekai context.
- Includes te reo; tikanga; karakia, waiata and manaakitanga; kai Māori and kaitiakitanga; whanaungatanga and mahi tahu; supervising health, safety and hygiene; and cooking complex dishes.

New Zealand Diploma in Manaaki Marae – Te Hāpai Ō Ki Muri (Level 5) [Ref: 2432]

- For people wanting to develop skills and knowledge at management or leadership level.
- Recognises leadership and management skills, developed in a wharekai context.
- Includes financing and managing kai; leading whanaungatanga; kai Māori and economic development of food technology; food safety and the requirements to register a commercial kitchen; planning and catering a hui for manuhiri, and evaluating catering; kai Māori and manaakitanga.

Career Opportunities

Skills and knowledge gained in the study of Manaaki Marae will prepare students for:

- various roles assisting whānau, hapū and iwi as well as contributing to, supporting, and/or leading the operational running of the wharekai; and, potentially, the strategic management of the wharekai and/or marae.
- roles as: café worker, wait staff, kitchenhand, food and beverage factory worker, kitchen steward, junior cook, ringawera, kaiārahi (wharekai), cook, trainee chef, maître d', caterer, restaurant manager, taurima/marae manager
- further study or employment in a range of areas such as Māori Business and Management, Māori Performing Arts, Māori Governance, Tourism/Tourism Māori, Hospitality, Retail and Front line Management.
