

The following is a sample of the Level 3-6 Kaupapa Hauora and Tikanga Hauora standards and is an example of the range of Hauora standards that are available in Field Māori. These standards are available for use by providers, schools and kura who have consent to assess.

### Kaupapa Hauora

**Level 3**

**Level 4**  
15309 Demonstrate knowledge of hauora Māori models and their application in a hauora context 3 credits

**Level 5**  
15304 Identify and analyse the impacts of whakamā and their implications on hauora outcomes 5 credits

**Level 6**  
18562 Identify, explain, and provide intervention strategies for at-risk situations for Māori 8 credits

### Tikanga Hauora

**Level 3**  
18356 Develop a substance abuse cessation programme in hauora context 3 credits

**Level 4**  
15314 Explain and apply tikanga when communicating with, and caring for, whānau in a hauora context 3 credits  
15316 Explain, apply and maintain personal and professional boundaries when working with whānau 3 credits

**Level 6**  
15317 Design and implement Māori health promotion programmes 6 credits

## Overview

### Te Pou Tautoko i te Ora (Kaupae 4)

*New Zealand Certificate in Social Services (Māori) (Level 4) [Ref: 2875]*

This qualification is intended for those seeking to increase their skills and knowledge to work with tāngata Māori and their whānau in a social services context. Under supervision, graduates will be able to deliver whānau-centred social services, explain legislative requirements and identify conflict situations.

### Te Pou Tautoko i te Ora (Kaupae 5)

*New Zealand Diploma in Social Services (Māori) (Level 5) [Ref: 2876]*

This qualification is intended for those seeking to extend their skills and knowledge to deliver social services to tangata Māori and their whānau. Under broad guidance, graduates will be able to implement whānau-centred models of service delivery in social services contexts, clarify and meet legislative requirements from a mātauranga Māori world view perspective and facilitate a conflict resolution process.

## Education Pathways

Subject to any prerequisites, students may continue their study to a Level 5 or 6 qualification, including:

- New Zealand Diploma in Whanau Ora (Level 5) [Ref: 2879]
- Te Pou Tautoko i te Ora (Level 5) [Ref: 2876]
- New Zealand Certificate in Kaupapa Māori Public Health (Level 5) [Ref: 2871]
- New Zealand Diploma in Kaupapa Māori Public Health (Level 6) [Ref: 2872]
- Progression to higher level qualifications in the social workers field.

## Career Opportunities

These qualifications provide a pathway for those seeking to work effectively in Māori communities amongst whānau, hapū, and/or iwi.

Graduates of the certificate will have transferable skills and knowledge to undertake roles as:

- Māori Health Advisor/Advocate
- Community worker
- Administrator
- Whānau Ora worker
- Social service worker
- Caregiver.

Graduates of the diploma will have the transferable skills and knowledge to undertake roles as:

- Whānau Ora advisor
- Whānau Ora advocator
- Whānau Ora negotiator
- Health promoter
- Cultural advisor in private and public sector.

Graduates of this qualification will also be able to contribute to meeting the needs and achieving the aspirations of tangata Māori, whānau, hapū, iwi, and hāpori by undertaking roles in:

- Call centre
- Kaiāwhina for District Health Board
- Access supervisor
- Kaiāwhina for non-government organisations
- Child Youth and Family escort.

## Review of Unit Standards

The Hauora Levels 5 and 6 unit standards are currently being reviewed to align the outcomes of the standards with the newly listed New Zealand qualifications. If you would like further information in regards to the unit standards, please contact Māori Qualification Services.
