Overview

Te Pōkairua Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Te Kaupae 5) [Ref: 3048]

New Zealand Diploma in Te Reo (Rumaki) (Level 5)

This qualification is intended for emerging speakers of Te Reo who have an advanced understanding, and ability in the use of, Te Reo. In addition to the acquisition of the language, graduates will have developed theoretical and technical knowledge and skills in Te Reo and research through the study of a topic of interest. Graduates will be able to communicate independently in Te Reo and express ideas and theories in a wide range of familiar and some less familiar situations with fluency and flexibility; and will also be able to research Te Reo related topics.

Te Pōkairua Reo (Rumaki) (Te Kaupae 6) [Ref: 3050]

New Zealand Diploma in Te Reo (Rumaki) (Level 6)

This qualification is intended for proficient speakers of Te Reo who have a desire to contribute positively to the development of Te Reo kia tika, kia rere, kia Māori; or who have a personal and/or professional interest in, Te Reo. In addition to the acquisition of Te Reo, graduates will have developed skills and knowledge of associated lexis in a specialised area. They will have also have specialised technical and theoretical knowledge to conduct research. Graduates will be able to communicate in Te Reo independently with spontaneity and precision to articulate the critique ideas and theories, and to seek information in whānau, marae, professional and/or academic contexts.

- roles within government and private sectors as administrators, policy analysts, liaison, cultural advisors, educator/teacher general and Te Reo Māori; Kaiawhina, Kaiarahi i Te Reo in Kohanga Reo, Kura Kaupapa Māori, primary schools, Māori radio trainees, health educators support workers, tour guides, hospitality positions, politics – hospital boards, regional boards, local council, and in parliament, workers in museums and within foreign embassies in New Zealand or overseas.
