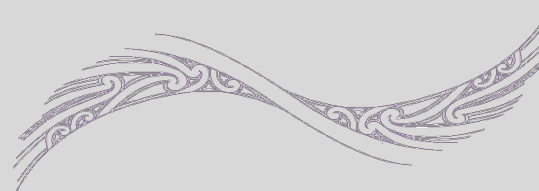

Overview

New Zealand Certificate in Tiaki Kuia, Koroua (Level 3) [Ref: 2873]

This introductory-level qualification provides a learning pathway for people already working with kuia, koroua and their whānau, or considering employment in this area. It also introduces people to whānau-centred approaches to the delivery of health services.

Under the guidance of a health professional and/or in accordance with a personal professional plan, graduates will be able to demonstrate understanding, knowledge and practical application of health services to kuia and koroua, based on whānau-centred models of practice.

New Zealand Certificate in Tiaki Kuia, Koroua (Level 4) [Ref: 2874]

This qualification is intended for those looking to consolidate and further their skills and knowledge in applying whānau-centred approaches relating to the care of kuia and koroua in residential communities, facilities or home settings.

Under broad guidance, graduates will be able to demonstrate theoretical technical knowledge and practical skills relating to the delivery of health services to kuia and koroua from a mātauranga Māori world view perspective and based on whānau-centred models of practice.

Education Pathways

Subject to any prerequisites, students may continue their study to a Level 4 or 5 qualification, including:

- New Zealand Certificate in Kaupapa Māori Public Health (Level 5) [Ref: 2871]

- New Zealand Diploma in Whānau Ora (Level 5) [Ref: 2879]
- Te Pou Tautoko i te Ora (Level 4) [Ref: 2875]
- Te Pou Tautoko i te Ora (Level 5) [Ref: 2876]
- Te Tuapapa he Whai i Te Ao Marama (Level 4) [Ref: 2880].

Career Opportunities

These qualifications provide a pathway for those seeking to work effectively in Māori communities amongst whānau, hapū, and/or iwi.

Graduates of the certificate will have the transferable skills and knowledge to act effectively in a range of kaitiaki roles, both Māori and non-Māori including:

- Activity support worker
- Care worker
- Caretaker
- Case worker
- Community health worker
- Elderly community mental health support worker
- Health care assistant
- Home help
- Kaiāwhina
- Personal caregiver
- Recreational therapist
- Whānau Ora navigator.

Review of Unit Standards
