

Overview

New Zealand Certificate in Tourism Māori (Level 3) [Ref: 2337]

- Foundation qualification aimed particularly at those people wishing to work within Tourism Māori operation and enterprises.
- Recognises skills unique to Tourism Māori.
- Includes manaakitanga, kaitiakitanga rangatiratanga, whanaungatanga and te tika me te pono.
- May also include – te reo Māori, computing, communication skills, health and physical education.
- Provides pathways to the New Zealand Certificate in Tourism Māori Level 4.

New Zealand Certificate in Tourism Māori (Level 4) [Ref: 2338]

- Builds on the knowledge and skills recognised by the New Zealand Certificate in Tourism Māori (Level 3).
- Recognises mātauranga Māori and generic industry knowledge to work in different facets of the tourism industry in Aotearoa.
- Manaakitanga, kaitiakitanga rangatiratanga, whanaungatanga, and te pono me te tika are covered in more depth.
- Provides pathways to the New Zealand Diploma in Tourism Māori Level 5.

New Zealand Diploma in Tourism Māori (Level 5) [Ref: 2339]

- Builds on the knowledge and skills recognised by the New Zealand Certificate in Tourism Māori (Level 4) and to optimise manuhiri experience.
- Applies advance knowledge of manaakitanga, kaitiakitanga, rangatiratanga, whanaungatanga and te tika me te pono.
- Maintains the integrity of mātauranga Māori in a tourism context.
- Provides transferable skills and knowledge to work in senior positions in the Tourism industry with an emphasis on Tourism Māori.
- Recognises pathways Applies relevant legislation.
- Applies work place practices in a professional, ethical and cultural manners.

Career Opportunities

Skills and knowledge gained in the study of Tourism Māori will prepare your students for:

- Various roles within their whānau, hapū and iwi as well as tour guiding, office administrator, customer service representative, receptionist, kaitiaki (tourism), visitor centre advisor, kaiwhakahaere (tourism), cultural advisor, Iwi tourism consultant, corporate/event manager.
- Further study or employment in a range of areas such as Business, Māori Performing Arts, Computing, Service Sector, and Māori Governance.
