Through its gripping storyline, and compelling characters, he cleverly utilizes horror tropes to mirror real-life racial tensions and tribulations.

~~The director uses the setting of~~ The director depicts important ideas through the setting ~~of~~ and its details. Jordan Peele demonstrated this through the setting of the Armitage family home. If or when watching the film you do not critically analyse you would not have noticed or discovered that the Armitage family home looks exactly like a ~~peet~~ plantation house. Chris the protagonist of the film is visiting his girlfriend Rose Armitage's family, ~~the~~

The important idea that Jordan Peele has revealed through the setting is that the Armitage family believes in ~~eto~~ colonialism. brought up in such a ~~q~~ ideological home or belief.

Another setting that revealed important ideas ~~throg~~ through the detail of the setting is the inside of the Armitage home. There is a particular scene where Dean Armitage Rose Armitage's father offers to give Chris a tour of the house. Whilst giving him a tour you notice ~~at~~ a various types of artifacts from around the world. Dean Armitage

says: "its such an experience to experience other cultures" this conveys colonialist ideology to experience others culture and to display artifacts from their culture or country. This detail is revealed through the detail of the setting. However, displaying artifacts from various cultures or indigenous culture has become such a norm in our society that we have glorified it by calling it souvenirs. Displaying artifacts from other cultures is an insight ~~as~~ in the view of the fact it has

become such a norm as a viewer you ~~don~~ do not notice, despite that when <sup>you</sup> critically <sup>you</sup> analyse you discover the colonialist ~~ideology~~ ideology that Jordan Peele is trying to demonstrate.

A particular important idea that was revealed through the setting is ~~the beginning of the film where~~ Rose Armitage's mother Missy Armitage's office. Her ~~profess~~ profession is <sup>improper</sup> a therapist, while having conversation with Chris she discovers that he is a smoker and Dean insists Chris to Missy to help him out. Later that night Missy invites Chris to her office ~~during~~ <sup>during</sup> an abnormal time during the night.

her office is isolated from the rest of the house. In her office she has two chairs one for herself and the other for the patient which in this case is Chris. This particular scene is very ~~are~~ uncomfortable for the viewing as Missip is asking ~~at~~ questions ~~the~~ about Chris's childhood she is constantly stirring a cup of tea with a silver spoon, she utilizes those to hypnotise. The office is ~~te~~ a very old-fashioned

study room. Missip stirring tea constantly conveys the ideology of colonialism due to the fact ~~that~~ of the tea trade Britain had with India demonstrating colonialism. Her stirring with a silver spoon represents her in the vein of the fact of ~~white~~ white supremacy.

When Chris is locked in a room with just him and a television in front of him sitting ~~in~~ on a single sofa

chair with a deer head hanging behind him.

The important ideas that are revealed through the details of the setting is the deer hanging behind him on the wall. The first interaction Chris had with Dean was him and Rose telling them how they ~~letted~~ accidentally hit a deer driving to their house. Dean ~~te~~ replies with "You know what I say? I say one down a couple hundred thousand to go." ~~this~~ This is a metaphor for black



individuals, hanging the deer up head implies that it is a trophy- this was cleverly demonstrated and depicted by the director. In that particular scene the deer is now Chris himself.

To conclude, Jordan Peele used his settings to reveal insightful details about characters. The film 'Get out' critiques systemic racial tribulations and racial thoughts through a horror trope.

However, the response does not fully explain how the details of the setting show the ideas.</p> <p>For a higher grade, the response needed to include more details on the physical, historical and social settings that referred to, and clearly show how these convey the idea of racism and colonialism.</p>
