

QUESTION ONE: *Artículo de revista* (Magazine article)

Read Text A on page 2 of the resource booklet.

(a) Name ONE similarity between Alma's Chilean culture and Polyfest.

(b) What reason does the article provide for this similarity?

B *I* U

The dance style and the clothing is similar.
Alma says that she went to Polyfest and watched the dances and music from different pacific countries. She felt a connection with the dance groups because she thought they looked like the typical dances of Rapa Nui, where her parents live. The sau sau and Samoan dances have smooth hand movements, the dancers wear traditional clothing from each country and the skirts are very similar. She thinks the dances are very similar because ancestors from Rapa Nui went to the Polynesian Islands.

(c) What benefits will Alma gain from joining the Pasifika group at her New Zealand school? Use information from the text to support your answer.

When Alma was younger her parents would dance many dance shows in Rapa Nui but they never taught her how to dance. They did teach her various sports though, after college in Chile there was athletics and gym three times a week and she was in a basketball team. Now she doesn't do any sport because she broke her leg.
