Explanatory Notes

- 2 Assessment will be consistent with the settings, perspectives and essential learning about New Zealand society, defined in *Social Studies in the New Zealand Curriculum*, and/or *Tikanga ā Iwi i Roto i te Marautanga o Aotearoa*.
- 3 *Significant idea(s)* about society must be derived from one or more achievement objectives at Level 8.
- 4 An advanced social studies inquiry requires the students to:
 - i state a focus for their inquiry, linked to a significant idea about society, and social studies perspective(s) related to the inquiry focus
 - ii develop and use research question(s) and/or data gathering questions that are appropriately designed, linked to the focus of the inquiry and cover the scope of the inquiry
 - iii determine and use ethical procedures applicable to the inquiry
 - iv select and use appropriate methodologies and tools (qualitative and/or quantitative) for information collection, recording, processing, and analysis
 - v identify and use primary and/or secondary sources from a range of perspectives
 - vi establish the relevance and accuracy of information
 - vii develop and use strategies to deal with problems and issues
 - viii determine and use a timeframe for the inquiry
 - ix identify how the findings will be communicated
 - x link conclusions to significant idea(s) about society and social studies perspectives related to the inquiry focus
 - xi develop criteria/questions to evaluate the inquiry process; these could include:
 - accuracy
 - relevance
 - sufficiency
 - inclusiveness
 - significance
 - areas for improvement, extension, follow-up.
- 5 *Independent* means the student will direct his/her own inquiry.
- 6 Terms:
 - an appropriate framework will include features numbered i to ix in EN 4 above
 - an appropriate and detailed framework will come from depth of coverage of the features numbered iii to ix in EN 4 above
 - a *valid conclusion* is relevant to the inquiry focus, based on the evidence from the inquiry
 - a *detailed conclusion* links a range of evidence from differing perspectives
 - a *justified conclusion* is a developed argument or position, supported by evidence from the inquiry
 - the *aspects* of an inquiry for evaluation are: framework, information, conclusions
 - *in depth* requires an evaluation of all aspects of the inquiry, links these evaluations to consider the inquiry overall, and makes recommendations for improvements and/or further investigations.
