*Demonstrate comprehensive understanding* involves giving a thorough explanation of the interaction of the key arguments of a psychological debate. The explanation will show the importance of each side of the debate.

- 3 *A psychological debate is* a discussion with multiple points of view. These views can be mutually exclusive or interact. Examples of debates include:
  - Free Will and Determinism
  - Individual and Situational explanations
  - Nature and Nurture
  - Reductionism and Holism.
