## **Explanatory Notes**

*Demonstrate thorough understanding* involves expanding on relevant information, ideas, and opinions from the texts with supporting detail; and showing understanding of the implied meanings or conclusions within the text.

- 3 *Written and/or visual French text(s)* refers to a variety of written and/or visual texts eg media extracts on topics of personal and/or community interest, short stories, articles, blogs, images, emails, advertisements, diagrams, posters, programmes, and reports. The texts will reflect the relationship between language and culture and be adapted as appropriate.
- 4 *On familiar matters* refers to regularly encountered information, ideas and opinions that will be expressed in clear standard written and/or visual French texts.
- 5 Evidence may include but is not limited to:
  - clarifying information, ideas, and opinions
  - summarising information, ideas and opinions
  - producing, annotating, amending, and completing visual representations of ideas eg maps, sketches, diagrams
  - rephrasing French statements for a different or specific purpose eg making a recommendation or giving advice.
