- 2 Religious or spiritual beliefs are one of the seven characteristics of religion along with experience, narratives, ritual, moral and ethical teachings, social organisation, and material expression. These beliefs are central understandings of religious and spiritual traditions. Examples include:
 - the Trinity, the Resurrection, the Incarnation
 - the Three Jewels, the Four Noble Truths, the Eightfold Path
 - animism
 - polytheism.
- 3 Significant factors may include any kind of natural or human event or circumstance that had a notable impact on the development of a community that shares religious or spiritual beliefs. Examples include:
 - conflict
 - migration
 - politics
 - natural disaster/environmental issues
 - secularisation
 - leadership.
