EITHER: QUESTION ONE: An established New Zealand choreographer

Explain how an established choreographer has influenced dance in Aotearoa/New Zealand, with specific reference to TWO of their influential dance works.

You might consider:

- themes in their work
- characteristic movement styles
- choreographic choices.

OR: QUESTION TWO: The New Zealand Dance Company

The New Zealand Dance Company describes its work as contemporary dance "reflecting our whenua (land) and rich dance culture".

Discuss ways in which The New Zealand Dance Company's work reflects the whenua and dance culture of Aotearoa/New Zealand.

You might include:

- themes and ideas
- movements
- innovations the company has made
- audience responses to its work.

OR: QUESTION THREE: A cultural dance form

Discuss the uses and meanings of a cultural dance form, and how these have developed or remained the same over time in Aotearoa/New Zealand.

You might include:

- stimulus of movements
- traditions
- innovations
- competitions.

OR: QUESTION FOUR: A partnering dance form

Explain how a partnering dance form has maintained its traditions and/or changed since it was first performed in Aotearoa/New Zealand.

You might include:

- settings and venues
- technology
- competitions.
