(a) What are the main features of each attraction?

They also identified that there are many shops on the walk to Ayashima takebayashi which would be fun to explore, rather than crowded stores at Kyoto station

They have also picked up the nuances in the text, for example they connect the study of geography and history to being useful as "journalists tend to travel around the world so for their job so knowing the countries, and the histories of specific places" would be useful.
