#### Notes for markers

Describing requires the candidate to **respond** with **evidence**, in relation to how a key message and drama components are used in the performance, and **explore** a connection to wairua in the performance.

*Explaining* requires the candidate to **justify**, with **detailed evidence**, how a key message and drama components are used in the performance for a specific **purpose**, and **explain** a connection to wairua in the performance.

*Examining* (showing deeper understanding) requires the candidate to **analyse** with **detailed evidence** how a key message and drama components are used in the performance for a specific **effect**, with a connection to wairua in the performance.

Drama components are elements, techniques, conventions, and/or technologies.

The wairua of the performance refers to the reciprocal relationship between performers and audience. Candidates could consider:

- The intended effect on the audience
- The connection between experiencing the live drama performance and their personal response
- The relationship between performers and audience expressed through ihi, wehi, and wana.

Ihi refers to the energy, magnetism or passion of a performer, which creates a response of awe or respect in the viewer.

Wehi refers to the viewer's personal reaction to the performers or performance.

Wana refers to the overall experience or emotional response to the performance as a whole.
