

National Certificate in Reo Māori (Level 4)

Purpose

The National Certificate in Reo Māori (Level 4) [Ref: 0426] is an introductory certificate awarded to people who have demonstrated competence in the knowledge and skills required for achievement in the domains of Kōrero, Whakarongo, Tuhituhi and Pānui of the Reo Māori subfield.

People awarded this qualification are beginning to use te reo Māori appropriately in a variety of settings. Through their knowledge of te reo Māori they are able to communicate with their target audience in te reo Māori and are able to use basic language and sentence structures appropriately. Skills gained in this qualification will be beneficial for people interested in working in relevant areas of the education, business and public sectors, the community, and the Māori arena.

This qualification provides a pathway to other qualifications on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) such as the National Diploma in Reo Māori (Level 5) [Ref: 1196] and the National Diploma in Reo Māori (Level 6) [Ref: 0722].

The qualification provides a sound basis from which to pursue further academic study and/or workplace training; leading to qualifications such as the National Certificate in Reo Māori Media (Introductory Media Skills) [Ref: 1024] and the National Certificate in Māori Performing Arts (Performance) (Level 4) [Ref: 0701]. Other NQF qualifications that may be of interest to the candidate include the National Certificate in Tourism Māori (Level 4) [Ref: 1077] and the National Diploma in Tourism Māori (Level 5) [Ref: 1096].

Korero and Whakarongo unit standards in this qualification require the attainment of credits for unit standards in both the Korero and Whakarongo domains at the preceding level before credit is sought at the next level. Similarly, for Tuhituhi and Pānui unit standards, credits are required for unit standards in both the Tuhituhi and Pānui domains at the preceding level. This is intended to enhance the development of Reo Māori knowledge and skills.
