Purpose

The National Certificate in Sport (Umpiring-Officiating) (Level 3) [Ref: 0445] recognises the skills required to manage local club, school or age-group teams at intermediate to top levels in the delivery of sport, with little or no direct supervision. Certificate holders are able to apply their knowledge and skills to familiar and new situations in the delivery of sport, involving complex, non-routine tasks of a broad range of variety.

This qualification recognises the specific skills of the sports coach, and is therefore distinct from the National Certificate in Sport (Level 3) with strands in Event Management, Sport Administration, and Team Management [Ref: 0446], and the National Certificate in Sport (Coaching) (Level 4) [Ref: 0444]. Each holder of this certificate will apply the specific skills of umpiring and officiating to their chosen sport code. The National Certificate in Sport (Level 2) [Ref: 0493] provides a generic introductory level sport qualification.

This qualification contains the Sport, Fitness and Recreation Industry Training Organisation Customer Service Award.

Previous versions of the qualification

Version 4 was reviewed and issued to take into account the review of the *Community Recreation* and *Sport* standards and industry initiatives.

Changes to structure and content

- Credit total has increased from 65 to 67.
- The domain of *recreation management including programmes and events* has been split into two domains - *recreation management* and *recreation programmes and events*.
- Standard 1984 has been replaced with 5365.
- Levels and titles of reviewed standards updated.
- Greater flexibility in the elective component by increasing the range to a minimum of 11 credits drawn from standards anywhere on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework.

For the purposes of this qualification, people who have gained credit for expiring standard 1984 will be exempt from the requirement to gain credit for standard 5365, which is considered more appropriate for this qualification.

Any version of a standard contained within this qualification which retains its original unit standard identification number will continue to meet the requirements of this qualification.

Skills Active Aotearoa Limited would like to encourage people currently working towards an earlier version of this qualification to transfer their results to the new version to ensure they continue to meet the latest standards, however they may choose to complete an earlier version. The last date for the award an earlier version of this qualification is 31 December 2004.

Version 3 was issued to take into account the review of the Community Recreation, Sport, and core health standards.

Version 2 was issued to reflect the outcome of the communication skills, core generic and service sector standards.

Version 1 was registered in March 1998.
