

## National Diploma in Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora (Pae Tuatoru) (Level 6)

This qualification has been **reviewed**. The last date to meet the requirements is 31 December 2015.

### Purpose

The National Diploma in Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora (Pae Tuatoru) (Level 6) is an advanced qualification that recognises achievement in the production aspects of Raranga.

The compulsory section recognises the underpinning tāniko and whāriki skills and knowledge of all role holders. The elective sections from the fields of Arts and Crafts, and Māori are included to support the range of programmes providers can offer and to enable candidates to specialise in an area of choice.

This diploma builds on the knowledge and skills recognised by the National Certificate in Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora (Pae Tuarua) (Level 4) [Ref: 0706].

Whakaruruhau - Raranga and the National Standards Body Māori both endorse the concept of lifelong learning and encourage people to consider future options on offer that build on this qualification, and, to enhance their career pathways.

### Replacement Information

This qualification has been replaced by the National Diploma in Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora (Pae Tuatoru) (Level 5) [Ref: 1640].
