Purpose

The National Certificate in Hauora (Māori Health) (Level 4) [Ref: 0710] is an introductory certificate awarded to candidates who have demonstrated capability in the knowledge and skills required for achievement in Hauora. It is designed for candidates who have an interest in Hauora, for those who are seeking gainful employment in Hauora or for those who are currently employed in Hauora.

Holders of this qualification are able to apply skills and knowledge as required by health providers, Māori health providers, Primary and Secondary Health Organisations, hospitals, institutions, marae, community centres and local clinics.

The compulsory section recognises knowledge and skills related to Māori health initiatives such as auahi kore, korikori tinana, tamariki ora, whānau ora and have an understanding of the Treaty of Waitangi and historical factors that impact on Hauora.

The elective section allows candidates to select from a diverse range of unit standards from various areas including Communication and Social Services, Health, Humanities and within Field Māori.

Tikanga pertinent to local rohe is interwoven through all practices of Hauora, including any interactions with whānau, hapū and iwi within a Hauora context. It also permeates any study of Māori models of health, or Māori history and best practice models within a Hauora context.

This qualification can build on the National Certificate in Health, Disability, and Aged Support (Core Competencies) (Level 3) [Ref: 1327]. Candidates completing this qualification would be able to pathway in to the National Diploma in Hauora (Māori Health) (Level 6) [Ref: 1657], the National Diploma in Social Work (Level 6) [Ref: 0989], or the National Diploma in Community Work (Level 6) [Ref: 0987]. This in turn could lead to further qualifications in Hauora or Social Services at a diploma or degree level.

Transition Arrangements

Version 3

Version 3 was issued following a review, and to take into account the review of the standards in the Hauora sub-field.

Changes to structure and content

- The total credit value for the qualification decreased from 90 to 62 credits.
- The credit value for the Compulsory Section decreased from 70 to 45 credits.
- Standards 15314, 18560, and 18566 have been added to the Compulsory Section.

- Standards 15311, 15315, and 16069 have been removed from the Compulsory Section, but can still be used to meet the requirements of the Elective Section.
- Standards 7257, 7258, 7261, 7262, 7265, 7266, 7269 and 7270, from sub-field Reo Māori have been removed from the qualification; however candidates can still choose standards from Field Māori toward the Elective section.
- The Elective section now requires a minimum of 17 credits instead of a minimum of 20 credits.
- The titles of standards 15299, 15308-15310 and 18561 have been updated.
- The level of 15309 has increased from 3 to 4.
- The credit value for standard 15310 has increased from 3 to 4, and the credit value for standard 18561 has decreased from 6 to 4.

Previous versions of the qualification

Version 2 was issued with the following changes to structure and content: the title of the qualification has changed to refer to Māori Health, rather than Māori Community Health and level added. The purpose statement has been updated to reflect industry requirements. Unit standards 3491, 16050, and 16069 have been added to the compulsory section; unit standards 7949, 7926, 7927 and 15312 have been removed; and the credit requirement has increased from 67 to 70. The Humanities field has been added to the credits required for the qualification has increased from 82 to 90.
