

National Certificate in Hauora (Māori Health) (Level 4)

Level 4

Credits 90

Purpose

This certificate is for people who have an interest in Hauora and for those who are seeking to gain employment in Hauora or who are employed in Hauora. It is an introductory qualification that recognises knowledge and skills related to Māori health initiatives such as manaakitangata, auahi kore, korikori tinana, tamariki ora, counselling, youth work, whānau work, drug and alcohol work, primary and secondary health services, social services and other community support services. People awarded this certificate will have gained knowledge in te reo Māori, Treaty of Waitangi and Hauora and tikanga.

Tikanga is interwoven through all practices of Hauora pertinent to the rohe and includes interaction with whānau, hapū, iwi and study of Māori models of health, Māori history and Māori best practice models. Holders of this qualification will have the skills and knowledge required to assist people by providing them with Hauora services delivered by health providers, Māori health providers, mainstream health services, institutions, marae, community centres and local clinics. The core compulsory unit standards offer an introduction to te reo Māori and can assist the candidate with basic te reo Māori when interacting with specific client groups.

This certificate qualifies the holder for entry into the National Diploma in Hauora (Māori Health) (Level 5) [Ref: 0711]. It also offers pathways in similar disciplines such as the National Diploma in Counselling (Level 6) [Ref: 0988], the National Diploma in Social Work (Level 6) [Ref: 0989], and the National Diploma in Community Work (Level 6) [Ref: 0987], National Certificate in Te Reo Māori (Level 4) [Ref: 0426].

Special Notes

In the subfield *Reo Māori*, candidates must have achieved credit for all the unit standards at level 1, or be able to demonstrate equivalent knowledge and skills, in order to achieve credit for any of the unit standards at level 2. These unit standards can be credited towards the National Certificate in Te Reo Māori (Level 4) [Ref: 0426].

Transition Arrangements

Version 2

This qualification was reviewed and issued as version 2 in April 2004.

Changes to structure and content

- The title of the qualification has changed to refer to Māori Health, rather than Māori Community Health and level added.
- The purpose statement has been updated to reflect industry requirements.
- Unit standards 3491, 16050, and 16069 have been added to the compulsory section; unit standards 7949, 7926, 7927 and 15312 have been removed; and the credit requirement has increased from 67 to 70.
- The Humanities field has been added to the elective section, and the credit requirement has increased from 15 to 20.
- Total credits required for the qualification have increased from 82 to 90.
