This certificate includes unit standards common to the National Diploma in Forestry (Forest Management) [Ref: 0232]. It provides a blend of skills including forestry business management, forestry operations, health and safety, environmental, supervisory management, and communications.

This qualification has been designed to allow people to choose the elective unit standards relevant to them.

This qualification adds a management dimension to the National Certificates in Forestry at level 4 and may lead on to the National Certificate in Forestry (Business Management) [Ref: 0820] or to the National Diploma in Forestry (Forest Management) [Ref: 0232] at level 6.
