1 purpose

The National Diploma in Community Recreation (Programme and Event Management) (Level 6) is designed for people with responsibility for running complex programmes and events. Holders of this qualification will have demonstrated a solid foundation in recreation theories and programme and event management as well as skills in written and interpersonal communication, business administration, and marketing.

This qualification is at a senior professional level, targeted at people who have the responsibility of planning, running, and marketing complex programmes and events, and for managing an organisational unit. It also shares some common unit standards with and builds on the competencies recognised in the National Certificate in Community Recreation (Programme and Event Management) (Level 4) [Ref: 0939] and the National Certificate in Community Recreation (Programme and Event Management) (Level 5) [Ref: 0940].

Community Recreation (Programme and Event Management) (Level 6)**2.2 summary of qualification requirements**

This qualification will be awarded to people credited with the compulsory unit standards and who have met the requirements of Electives 1-6.

Compulsory

All the unit standards listed are required.

Elective 1

The unit standards listed in either Set A or Set B are required.

Elective 2

A minimum of 12 credits at level 6 or above is required from the specified domain.

Elective 3

A minimum of 10 credits at level 5 or above, and a minimum of 10 credits at level 6 or above, is required from the specified domain.

Elective 4

A minimum of 16 credits at level 5 or above is required from the specified domain.

Elective 5

A minimum of 10 credits at level 5 or above, and a minimum of 5 credits at level 6 or above, is required from the domains listed.
