1 purpose

The National Certificate in Māori (Te Ngutu Awa) (Level 4) [Ref: 1006] is a progression from the 'gateway' qualification National Certificate in Māori (Te Waharoa) (Level 2) [Ref: 0878]. From a Māori perspective, this qualification pathway represents the journey from the 'gateway' towards the whare tipuna of the marae.

The National Certificate in Māori (Te Ngutu Awa) (Level 4) has been specifically designed to appeal to Māori with a view to increasing representation of Māori at the higher levels of education and training. The requirements of this level 4 qualification have been left non-prescriptive deliberately, to enable providers to offer a package to suit their candidates.

Māori (Te Ngutu Awa) (Level 4)

The qualification recognises the advancement and achievement of skills in the field Māori and offers candidates enhanced opportunities to continue learning at higher levels in specific pathways of the National Qualifications Framework.

People awarded a level 4 qualification have shown that they can work independently and with responsibility for quality. They have the ability to analyse and interpret information and problem solve; and can apply a range of practical and academic skills.

2 regulations for the qualification

2.1 entry information for programmes of education and training assessed against the unit standards in the qualification

2.2 summary of qualification requirements

The National Certificate in Māori (Te Ngutu Awa) (Level 4) will be awarded to people credited with a minimum of 90 credits and who have met the requirements of the two elective sections.

2.3 detailed qualification requirements

Elective A

A minimum of 50 credits at level 3 or above, of which 40 credits must be at level 4 or above, is required from the following field:

Elective B

A minimum of 40 credits, at level 4 or above, is required from the anywhere on the National Qualifications Framework.

3 accreditation option

Evaluation of documentation and visit by NZQA and representatives of the National Standards Body Māori.
