

National Certificate in Reo Māori Media (Introductory Media Skills)

This qualification is **expiring**. The last date to meet the requirements is 31 March 2011.

Purpose

The National Certificate in Reo Māori Media (Introductory Media Skills) [Ref: 1024] is designed to raise the quality of te reo Māori within the media industry, while focusing on the core media and journalism skills required to work in Māori radio, television and print. The qualification is aimed primarily at people already working within the reo Māori media industry but will also be useful for those wishing to pursue a career in this industry.

The qualification comprises compulsory standards designed to assess a broad range of skills including presenting for radio, working with video, writing, and proficiency in te reo Māori.

People who have met the requirements of this qualification will also meet the requirements of the National Certificate in Reo Māori (Level 4) [Ref: 0426]. The National Certificate in Reo Māori Media (Introductory Media Skills) also provides people with the necessary skills for entry to the proposed National Diploma in Reo Māori Media, which is intended to be delivered and assessed predominantly in te reo Māori.

Replacement Information

This qualification was replaced by the National Certificate in Reo Māori Media (Introductory Media Skills) (Level 3) [Ref: 1629] and the National Certificate in Reo Māori Media (Foundation Media Skills) (Level 4) [Ref: 1630].

Special Notes

The *Reo Māori* standards in this qualification require the attainment of credits for standards in both the *kōrero* and *whakarongo* domains at the preceding level before credit is sought at the next level. Similarly, credits are required for both the *tuhituhi* and *pānui* domains at the preceding level. The recommended pathways are shown in the relationships diagram later in this document.

It is also recommended that candidates possess basic level word processing skills and knowledge of Occupational Safety and Health principles.

Those people who already informally possess relevant skills and knowledge are encouraged to seek recognition of that expertise through assessment of current competence.
