Purpose

The purpose of this qualification is to recognise the skills and knowledge of those working in customary fishing management. Holders of this qualification will be able to demonstrate a range of technical skills and knowledge, including customary fishing authorisation procedures, practices and management, and compliance and legislation. It also allows for some flexibility to recognise skills and knowledge in other seafood and Māori related topics.

This qualification builds on skills and knowledge from the National Certificate in Seafood Māori (Customary Fishing) (Level 3) [Ref: 1064].

Transition Arrangements

Version 2

Version 2 was issued as a result of a review to ensure the qualification met the current needs of the industry, to recognise the knowledge and skills required to operate in the area of customary fishing management.

Changes to structure and content

- Standard 20328 was replaced by standard 20911 in the compulsory section
- Group B has been removed, with Groups C and D being changed to Groups B and C respectively
- The minimum credits for Groups A, B and C have been changed
- The credit range table has been updated in keeping with all changes made.
