Purpose

This qualification is designed for people working in airport fire prevention and fire and rescue services. It is the first of a suite of three progressive qualifications developed for airport fire and rescue fire fighters and designed to be accessible to fire and rescue staff at the different airport categories. The qualification recognises the basic skills and competencies required of fire and rescue personnel in airport fire and rescue services, and also includes skills from the areas of structural and industrial fire and rescue.

The qualification comprises a compulsory and an elective section. The compulsory section includes standards covering workplace emergency risk management, driving of rescue fire vehicles in airport environments, knowledge of aircraft for fire and rescue operations, safety in the workplace, first aid, fire science principles, and the delivery of water supplies for fire fighting while the elective section enables credits from anywhere on the National Qualifications Framework.

This qualification may lead on to the National Certificate in Fire and Rescue Services – Airport (Level 3) [Ref: 1454] and is a requirement for award of that qualification. Elective standards included in that qualification have prerequisites which could be included as part of the elective set for this qualification.

Transition Arrangements**Version 2**

Version 2 was issued following a review of the suite of airport fire and rescue qualifications and to take account of the changes made to standard 497 as a result of its review.

Changes to structure and content

- Title changed to remove the 'Basic' descriptor.
- Standard 17279 added to the compulsory section.
- Standards 3272, 3285 and 10614 removed from the qualification.
- Total credit requirements increased from 44 to 46.
- Elective section added to the qualification, allowing credits to be selected from anywhere on the NZQF.

People currently working towards version 1 of this qualification may either complete the requirements for that version or transfer their results to this version of the qualification.

It is not intended that anyone is disadvantaged by this review, and the above arrangements have been designed for a smooth transition. However, anyone who feels they have been disadvantaged may appeal to the Fire and Rescue Services Industry Training Organisation at the address below.
