- Producing sheet-fed laminated work, which includes: checking job documentation and confirming job requirements; making ready and running the sheet-fed laminator; checking quality; cleaning the machine and preparing jobs for next process;
- Undertaking typography which includes formatting type and design; and creating proofs to meet requirements;
- Applying knowledge of: colour models, gamuts, spaces and profiles (including ICC profiles); and methods for measuring colour in printing related contexts of monitor (display), substrate and ambient light.

Version 1 of this qualification and version 1 of the New Zealand Certificate in Signmaking (Level 4) [Ref: 1825] **replaced** an existing qualification listed on the NZQF, the National Certificate in Signmaking with strands in Computer Graphics, Hand Lettering, and Electric Signmaking [Ref: 0306].

Existing candidates may complete the requirements of [Ref: 1824] or [Ref: 1825] or transfer their results to [Ref: 3570].

The last date for entry into programmes leading to the replaced gualifications is 31 December 2018.

The last date for assessments to take place is 31 December 2022, at which time the qualifications will be discontinued.
