Kia puāwai te pitomata

Kia whakatairanga te pitomata o te tangata me ōna tātai pūmanawa ki te reo me ngā tikanga i roto i ōna ao mōhio o mua, o nāianei, mō āpōpō hoki.

Mana Whenua

Tūrangawaewae

Mā te mōhio o te tangata ki tōna tūrangawaewae me tōna rangatiratanga e pūmau ai te reo me ngā tikanga ki tōna whenua, ki tōna taiao o mua, o nāianei, o āpōpō hoki.

This mātāpono promotes the importance of location and the local environment; the places, the people, the stories, the sayings, and dialectal variations.

Mana Reo

Kia tangata whenua ai te reo

Kia marama pū ki te pūtake, te whānui, te hōhonu, te tiketike o te reo me ngā tikanga o te tangata i roto i ngā ao mōhio o mua, o nāianei, mō āpōpō hoki ā, e ai ki te mana reo kua tangata whenua kē te reo. This mātāpono encourages each learner to access, grow, develop, and use multiple reo and tikanga literacies accurately and competently in settings that include cultural, intellectual, social, emotional, digital environs, second language acquisition theories, and pedagogy.

Mana Ao Tūroa

Te ngoi me te korou e tūhonohono ana, e whakaihiihi ana i ngā mea katoa o te ao kikokiko nei, he kawenga hoki i te mana o te tangata, o te mea rānei i te ao o mua, o nāianei, mō āpōpō hoki.

This mātāpono refers to the acquisition of proficiency and ultimately excellence as a practitioner of te reo and tikanga and its application in a chosen field of endeavour as it is expressed in the natural world.
