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Kotahitanga

This kaupapa embraces the essence of working collaboratively and in mana enhancing ways in a range of contexts and perspectives.

Te Pono me te Tika

This kaupapa ensures cultural, social, legislative and legal obligations are fit for purpose.

Rangatiratanga

This kaupapa encourages the demonstration of leadership and positive role modelling in the delivery of Māori business.

Whanaungatanga

This kaupapa embraces Māori cultural values, te reo Māori, tikanga and kawa in establishing, building and maintaining quality relationships.
