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#### Main changes resulting from the revision

Version 2 of this qualification includes the following changes:

- Indicative credits for graduate profile outcomes 2, 3 and 6 have increased.
- Indicative credits for graduate profile outcome 5, 7 and 8 have decreased.
- The total credit value for this qualification has increased from 160 (185-215 with optional strands) to 180 (200-235 with optional strands).
