The next qualification review is planned to take place during 2022.

Summary of review and consultation process

Industry requested a review of Connexis' Bituminous Surfacing Construction qualifications. The skills and knowledge described in these qualifications were not relevant for trainees and made it difficult to achieve all the qualification graduate profile outcomes. Connexis commenced an early review with industry stakeholders to review the qualification graduate profile outcomes and make these relevant to the infrastructure industry.

Main changes resulting from the review

- The two existing New Zealand qualifications were replaced with one qualification specialising in bitumen surfacing construction;
- The two New Zealand qualifications will be discontinued.

Any new enrolments will be in the replacement qualification.
