Outcome 3

Describe risks and prevention strategies for vertebrate pest management methods.

Range trapping, poisoning, baits, shooting.

Performance criteria

3.1 Risks associated with each animal control method are described.

Range risks to – the applicator, bystanders, the environment.

3.2 Prevention strategies used to limit the occurrence of the risks associated with each animal control method are described in terms of safety procedures and application of organisational requirements.
