*Enterprise procedures* – procedures used by the organisation carrying out the work and applicable to the tasks being carried out. Examples are – standard operating procedures, safety procedures, equipment operating procedures, codes of practice, quality management practices and standards, procedures to comply with legislative and local body requirements.

- 3 Maintenance activities are those usually carried out on an aircraft in a hangar.
- 4 Systems may include emergency locator transmitter, personal/portable locator transmitter, underwater locator beacon.

- 1.3 Aircraft registration and system to be maintained are matched with documentation.
- 1.4 Aircraft and system are prepared for the application of power and for system operation.
  - Range cockpit controls match component positions, clearances, isolation tags, warning signs.
- 1.5 Ground and/or support equipment is positioned ready for system operation.

### Outcome 2

Locate defects in aircraft emergency locater beacon systems.

### Performance criteria

2.1 Serviceability is determined.

Range inspect, assess, test.

2.2 Defects are reported and documented.

### Outcome 3

Restore airworthiness of aircraft emergency locater beacon systems.

### Performance criteria

- 3.1 Methods of rectifying defects are determined.
- 3.2 Replacement parts are procured and verified as authentic and serviceable.

Range identify, inspect.

3.3 Defects are rectified.

Range may include but is not limited to – repair, replace, modify, adjust, calibrate, lubricate.

- 3.4 System is tested to verify serviceability.
- 3.5 Inspections are obtained.

Range independent, duplicate, progressive.

Complete the maintenance task for aircraft emergency locater beacon systems.

### Performance criteria

4.1	Aircraft, system, and work area are left in a state that enables the next task to begin.		
4.2	Resources a	are checked for serviceability and returned to service or storage.
