Elements and performance criteria

Element 1

Manufacture and fix flat timber tops.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 The timber tops are identified from the specifications.
- 1.2 The materials are calculated and an order is placed in accordance with workplace practice.
- 1.3 The tops are set out to conform to the carcass dimensions.
- 1.4 The timber is machined to conform to the set-out in accordance with workplace practice.
- 1.5 Adhesive is applied and the tops are assembled to conform to the requirements of the specification.
- 1.6 The tops are trimmed and finished to conform to the carcass dimensions and specifications.
- 1.7 Attachments are fitted to the tops in accordance with the working drawings and specifications.
- 1.8 Tops are fixed to the carcasses as detailed on the working drawings.

Element 2

Manufacture and fix flat processed tops.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Tops are identified from the specifications.
- 2.2 Materials are calculated and an order is placed in accordance with workplace practice.
- 2.3 Tops are machined to conform to the carcass dimensions.
- 2.4 Attachments are fitted to the tops in accordance with the working drawings and specifications.
- 2.5 Tops are fixed to the carcasses as detailed on the working drawings.

Please note
