## Elements and performance criteria

### Element 1

Identify defects.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Joinery items are inspected and defective parts are identified and documented in accordance with workplace practice.
- 1.2 Replacement materials are identified and measured in accordance with workplace practice.

### Element 2

Describe the process for remedying defects.

#### Performance criteria

- 2.1 The process for cutting away defects is described in terms of workplace practice.
- 2.2 The process for machining new material to match the existing profiles is described in terms of workplace practice.
- 2.3 The process for working joints is described in accordance with workplace practice.
- 2.4 The process for fixing replacement components to match existing profiles is described in terms of workplace practice.
- 2.5 The process for trimming and finishing joinery items to the requirements of the specifications is described in terms of workplace practice.

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### Please note
