Elements and performance criteria

Element 1

Describe working drawings and specifications for joinery items.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Working drawings and specifications are described in terms of their intent.
- 1.2 The requirements of relevant New Zealand Standards are described for specified joinery items.

Element 2

Identify and describe the provisions of workplace requirements and regulations for materials and work, not specified in work documents.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Selected materials, not specified in the job brief, are identified and described in terms of their purpose and legislative requirements.
- 2.2 Requirements, not specified on the job brief, are identified and described in terms of NZS 3610 and/or NZS 3619.

Please note

Providers must be accredited by NZQA, or an inter-institutional body with delegated authority for quality assurance, before they can report credits from assessment against unit standards or deliver courses of study leading to that assessment.
