Purpose	This unit standard is for fire and emergency personnel in situations requiring the use of self-contained breathing apparatus (BA) primarily for general emergencies.
	People credited with this unit standard are able to: - demonstrate knowledge of BA and its effects on the physiology of the human body; - recommission, test, and wear the BA in simulated conditions; - manage the BA for safe use and survivability; and - shut down and recommission the BA.

- 5 Definitions

Breathing apparatus (BA) refers to self-contained breathing apparatus. Fire and emergency agency's requirements refer to policies, procedures, and supporting documentation on safety and operation set down by each fire and emergency agency employer, or host organisation.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of BA and its effects on the physiology of the human body.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 The main components, safety features, and procedures of BA are explained in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications.
 - Range procedures include but are not limited to types, frequency, and purpose of testing.
- 1.2 Conditions leading to the wearing of BA are described and the necessity of wearing BA is explained.
 - Range any potentially irrespirable atmosphere including but not limited to smoke, dust, poisonous gasses, lack of oxygen, high heat.
- 1.3 The physical and psychological effects from wearing BA are described.
- 1.4 Procedures in case of BA failure are explained.

Outcome 2

Recommission, test, and wear the BA in simulated conditions.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 BA is recommissioned, and routine tests and checks are carried out and recorded.
 - Range visual inspection, high pressure test, low pressure test, ancillary and/or safety equipment check, communications check.
- 2.2 BA is donned and started up.
- 2.3 Entry control procedures are established and followed.
- 2.4 Search procedures are carried out whilst wearing BA.
- 2.5 Communication is maintained.

Outcome 3

Manage the BA for safe use and survivability.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Hazards are identified and risks assessed.
- 3.2 Air supply is regularly monitored, assessed, and communicated in accordance with the nature of the incident.
 - Range crew, self.

Outcome 4

Shut down and recommission the BA.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 BA is shut down.
- 4.2 Information is reported and relayed.
- 4.3 BA is recommissioned and routine tests and checks are carried out.

Range includes but is not limited to – cleaning, cylinder change, visual

inspection, high pressure test, low pressure test, ancillary and/or

safety equipment check, communications check.

4.4 Recordings are completed.
