- 1.1 Explain the weather terms fronts (warm, cold), lows, highs, isobars and describe the weather typically associated with them.
- 1.2 Explain weather associated with different cloud types.

Range cirrus, cumulus, nimbus.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of basic survival skills and emergency shelter for the outdoors.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Describe basic personal survival equipment.
- 2.2 Describe the features of communication devices used in the outdoors.

Range three different types of communication devices.

2.3 Construct a personal emergency shelter that provides protection from the prevailing weather conditions.

Outcome 3

Demonstrate the use of a map.

Performance criteria

3.1 Describe map information.

Range information includes but is not limited to – scale, symbols, gridlines, contours, border information.

- 3.2 Locate visible features in the environment on the map.
- 3.3 Identify features from the map in environment.
- 3.4 Estimate travel time between two points on a map.
- 3.5 Use a 6-figure grid reference to communicate a location on a topographical map.
- 3.6 Orientate map using natural features and navigate to a set point.
