2 Definitions

Current industry good practice means the range of actions currently accepted within the adventure and outdoor sector to manage the risk of harm to staff, participants, and others.

Tikanga are generic rules and protocols, the customary system of values and practices that have developed over time.

Trusted contact refers to the person that the 'outdoor user' gives their Outdoors Intentions details to, whether by email, printed copy, form or via an external website provider.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of introductory preparation for an outdoor activity.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Identify and list the personal clothing and equipment required for the outdoor activity.
- 1.2 List the group and safety equipment that is required for the outdoor activity.
- 1.3 List food and hydration requirements for the outdoor activity.
- 1.4 Describe the weather forecast for the activity date and location.
- 1.5 Provide trip intentions for the outdoor activity to a trusted contact.

Range

trusted contact includes but is not limited to – Mountain Safety Council Plan my Walk, Adventure Smart Outdoor Intentions. Intentions includes but is not limited to – where you are going, how you are getting there, who is going, what emergency equipment is taken, departure time and date, expected return date and time, emergency contact details.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate basic knowledge of the location of an outdoor activity.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Identify the activity location or route on a map.
- 2.2 Describe three factors about the activity location or route.

Range factors may include but are not limited to – environment, proximity

to emergency services, access, transport, tikanga, history.
