- 6 Definitions

Contemporary refers to post-1945.

Imagery may include but is not limited to photographs, pictures, photocopies, videos. Kete tahā/hue is a basket designed to contain rounded gourd (traditional, holding preserved food i.e.: ipu, oko, mata, kai ota, hue) or container (contemporary). Quality ensures whenu is graded to complete task. Includes but is not limited to – broken, infected or discoloured rau.

Quantity ensures enough whenu is prepared to complete kete tahā/hue.

Size refers to whenu width and length.

Specifications may include but is not limited to – title/untitled, artist details including whakapapa connections, dates of construction, dimensions (length, width, height), collection details.

Traditional refers to pre-1945.
