Make a difference to hauora

Hauora is designed for people interested in or already working in the health sector, and who have a particular interest in the health and well being of Māori.

The national qualifications in hauora will give skills such as tikanga, te reo, tamariki ora, oranga kaumātua, rangatahi ora, manaaki ki te tangata, in hospitals and at home. Skills also cover addiction and cessation programmes such as auahi kore, gambling addiction, alcohol and substance abuse, food addiction, healthy lifestyles and a study of traditional and modern kai and activities. Hauora research includes Te Tiriti o Waitangi, Māori role models and Māori models of wellness.

What are the national qualifications in hauora?

There are two national qualifications in hauora:

- National Certificate in Hauora (Māori health) (level 4)
- National Diploma in Hauora (Māori health) (level 5).

These qualifications are for people who have an interest in hauora and for those who are seeking to gain employment in hauora or who are already employed in hauora. People awarded with these qualifications will have gained knowledge in te reo Māori, Te Tiriti o Waitangi, tikanga, research and hauora.

Local tikanga is interwoven through all practices of hauora and includes interaction with tūrora, whānau, hapū and iwi.

Where can I study hauora?

National qualifications registered on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) are only available from education providers that are registered with the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) and accredited to offer national qualifications.

Information for learners

National Certificate in Hauora (Māori health) (level 4)

The National Certificate in Hauora (level 4) is an introductory qualification that recognises knowledge and skills related to

- Māori health initiatives such as tikanga, te reo, Tiriti o Waitangi, principles; and
- key concepts of hauora including manaakitanga, supporting tūroro and their whānau in hospitals and at home
- community health programmes such as auahi kore, korikori tinana, tamariki ora and oranga rangatahi which includes working with youth health issues, addictions, study of traditional models of personal safety in the workplace and writing reports.

Holders of this qualification will be able to assist people by providing them with knowledge and skills associated with hauora services delivered by health providers, Māori health providers, mainstream health services, institutions, marae and hospitals. The core compulsory unit standards also offer an introduction to te reo Māori and can assist learners with basic te reo Māori when interacting with Māori client groups

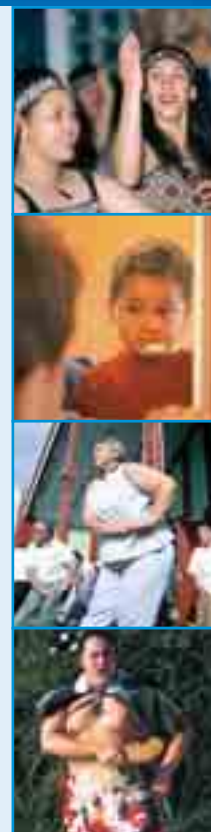
This certificate qualifies the holder for entry into the National Diploma in Hauora (level 5). It also offers other pathways in similar disciplines such as the National Certificate in Te Reo Māori (level 4), the National Diploma in Counselling (level 6), the National Diploma in Social Work (level 6) and the National Diploma in Community Work (level 6).

National Diploma in Hauora (Māori health) (level 5)

The National Diploma in Hauora (level 5) builds on the skills and knowledge recognised by the National Certificate in Hauora (level 4) and is intended for people who want to enhance their knowledge and skills in Hauora. The National Diploma recognises advanced knowledge, skills and application in hauora best practice models, hauora research, Māori leadership in hauora, further study of addiction and cessation programmes, hauora development and delivery, effective communication strategies in hauora, analysis of risk behaviour and conflict resolution, public health in hauora, disease state management for Māori, impact of colonisation on hauora and mana motuhake for Māori in hauora.

The core compulsory unit standards extend the learner's competency in te reo Māori, which can assist their interaction with specific client groups. Tikanga is interwoven through all practices of hauora pertinent to the rohe and includes interaction with whānau, hapū and iwi. The core compulsory units also extend the learner's competency through the study of Māori models of health, Māori history of hauora and Māori best practice models.

Candidates who are awarded both the National Certificate and the National Diploma in Hauora will also have met the requirements for the National Certificate in Te Reo Māori (level 4) and may make a separate application for that qualification.



What are the benefits of studying towards national qualifications in hauora?

- **Recognition** – have your Māori skills, learning and knowledge formally recognised nationally and internationally.
- **Work at your level of expertise** for example, there is no need to complete a level 4 qualification before starting on a level 5 qualification.
- **Expert development** – nationally recognised Māori experts develop and monitor all the unit standards in field Māori.
- **Quality assurance** – national standards and qualifications are developed and rigorously checked through a registration process, and assessments are moderated for national consistency.
- **Flexibility** – you can earn credits while you work or while you study at an accredited provider, or choose a combination of both.
- **Portability** – credits from the National Certificate or National Diploma in Hauora can count towards other national qualifications on the NQF and vice versa.
