Study the uniqueness of Tourism Māori

The tourism industry needs people who can promote, enhance and protect the uniqueness of tourism Māori in Aotearoa. Gaining a national qualification in Tourism Māori will give you the specialist skills and knowledge to pursue a career in this exciting market.

What are national qualifications in Tourism Māori?

There are three national qualifications in Tourism Māori:

- National Certificate in Tourism Māori (level 3)
- National Certificate in Tourism Māori (level 4)
- National Diploma in Tourism Māori (level 5).

These three qualifications have been developed by NZQA in consultation with experts in the tourism industry. They recognise the uniqueness of tourism Māori in Aotearoa and incorporate kaitiakitanga, manaakitanga, whakawhānaungatanga and tikanga practices.

People holding these national qualifications will have knowledge and skills in all facets of the tourism industry. They will also demonstrate achievement and high-level knowledge of tourism Māori practices.

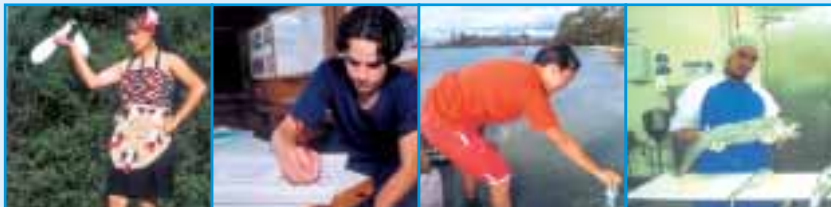
Where can I study Tourism Māori?

National qualifications registered on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) are only available from education providers that are registered with NZQA and accredited to offer national qualifications.

Information for learners

National Certificate in Tourism Māori (level 3)

Credits 60

The National Certificate in Tourism Māori (level 3) is aimed at those people wishing to work within Tourism Māori operations and enterprises.

Unit standards in Environmental Tourism Māori and Tourism Māori Practices recognise those skills unique to Tourism Māori. Unit standards in Visitor Services enhance the learner's ability to work effectively in all facets of the tourism industry. The elective section in this qualification allows the learner to choose from a range of credits in Computing, Service Sector, Communication Skills (including numeracy and literacy) and other Tourism Māori subjects.

National Certificate in Tourism Māori (level 4)

Credits 60

The National Certificate in Tourism Māori (level 4) builds on the skills gained through attaining the National Certificate in Tourism Māori (level 3). It continues to recognise kaupapa Māori and the broad knowledge required to work in different facets of the tourism industry in Aotearoa.

Concepts such as whakawhanangatanga, manaakitanga, kaitiakitanga and tikanga practices, which were examined in the level 3 qualification, are covered in more depth by the standards included in the compulsory section of this qualification.

Learners may choose from a broad range of subjects in the elective section, including First Line Management, Computing, Communication Skills, or from higher level Tourism Māori standards.

This certificate provides a pathway to higher studies towards the National Diploma in Tourism Māori (level 5) or the National Diploma in Tourism (level 5).

National Diploma in Tourism Māori (level 5)

The National Diploma in Tourism Māori (level 5) is in the final stages of development. Detailed requirements for this course will be available from July/August 2004. You will then be able to access information about the qualification via the NZQA website. The diploma follows on from the National Certificate in Tourism Māori (level 4), and will extend the knowledge already attained by learners.

This qualification is intended for people already working or pursuing a business career in tourism within Aotearoa.

The core compulsory unit standards will focus on specific environmental and tourism Māori practices further advancing the skills in tourism Māori. The elective section will provide the knowledge and skills required by those in supervisory and management roles.

Concepts such as whakawhanangatanga, manaakitanga, kaitiakitanga and tikanga practices, which were examined in the National Certificates, will continue to be a focus in the diploma qualification.

People awarded this qualification will have attained fundamental skills in first line management, computing, communication, Māori and the service sector.



What are the benefits of studying towards national qualifications in Tourism Māori?

- **Recognition** – have your Māori skills, learning and knowledge formally recognised nationally and internationally.
- **Work at your level of expertise** – for example, there is no need to complete a level 3 qualification before starting on a level 4 qualification.
- **Expert development** – nationally recognised Māori experts develop and monitor all the unit standards in field Māori.
- **Quality assurance** – national standards and qualifications are developed, rigorously checked through a registration process and assessments are moderated for national consistency.
- **Flexibility** – you can earn credits while you work or while you study at an accredited provider, or choose a combination of both.
- **Portability** – credits from National Certificates or the National Diploma in Tourism Māori can count towards other national qualifications on the NQF and vice versa.
