

The following is a sample of the Level 1-6 Kaupapa Hauora standards and is an example of the range of Hauora standards that are available in Field Māori. These standards are available for use by providers, schools and kura who have consent to assess.

### Level 1

14235 Explain hauora and influences on hauora, and examine ways for improving hauora 3 credits

### Level 3

15312 Explain implications of legislation on hauora Māori 6 credits

18357 Develop, implement, and evaluate a substance abuse awareness programme for rangatahi 3 credits

### Level 4

15309 Demonstrate knowledge of hauora Maori models and their application in a hauora context 3 credits

18561 Compile a database of hauora service providers, and identify and explain referral policies and processes 4 credits

### Level 5

15304 Identify and analyse the impacts of whakamā and their implications on hauora outcomes 5 credits

15311 Relate Māori mana motuhake to working in hauora 4 credits

### Level 6

15306 Analyse and compare primary health care service provision to Māori 6 credits

15313 Review current hauora Māori priorities and associated issues and policies 6 credits

18562 Explain at-risk behaviour for Māori and its impact on hauora 8 credits

# Hauora

## • Kaupapa Māori Public Health (Levels 4, 5 and 6)



### Overview

#### **New Zealand Certificate in Kaupapa Māori Public Health (Level 4) [Ref: 2870]**

This qualification is intended for those who are already working, or who are seeking to work, under broad guidance in the area of kaupapa Māori public health.

The purpose of this qualification is to provide graduates who can preserve, protect, and promote the health and wellbeing of whānau, hapū, iwi, marae, and Māori communities.

Graduates will be able to understand and explain a kaupapa Māori public health perspective from social, economic, cultural and environmental contexts that contributes to the reduction of Māori health disparities.

#### **New Zealand Certificate in Kaupapa Māori Public Health (Level 5) [Ref: 2871]**

This qualification is intended for those who are already working, or seeking to work under limited supervision in the area of kaupapa Māori public health.

The purpose of this qualification is to provide graduates who can preserve, protect, and promote strategies to improve the health and wellbeing of whānau, hapū, iwi, marae, and Māori communities.

Graduates will be able to develop, and apply a kaupapa Māori public health perspective from social, economic, cultural and environmental contexts that contributes to the reduction of Māori health disparities.

#### **New Zealand Diploma in Kaupapa Māori Public Health (Level 6) [Ref: 2872]**

This qualification is intended for those who have advanced knowledge of te ao Māori and extensive experience working with Māori communities.

The purpose of this qualification is to provide graduates who can lead, promote, and enhance the continued development of kaupapa Māori public health, and encourage Māori to take control of their social, economic, cultural, and collective wellbeing.

Graduates will be able to design and evaluate kaupapa Māori public health initiatives incorporating social, economic, cultural and environmental contexts that contribute to the reduction of Māori health disparities.

### Education Pathways

These qualifications may:

- lead to further study at higher levels in the public health sector
- also provide graduates with a pathway for entry into degree level programmes in the health sector.

### Career Opportunities

These qualifications provide a pathway for those seeking to work effectively in Māori communities amongst whānau, hapū, and/or iwi.

Graduates of the certificate will have the transferable skills and knowledge to potentially secure roles in the Kaupapa Māori and the general public health sector including:

- kaupapa Māori public health environment coordinator
- kaupapa Māori public health promoter, facilitator, and liaison.

Graduates of the diploma will have the transferable skills and knowledge to potentially secure roles as:

- kaupapa Māori public health manager
- kaupapa Māori manager in planning and funding
- kaupapa Māori public health environment manager
- health contracts manager
- senior health adviser
- senior health analyst
- senior health manager.

### Review of Unit Standards

The Hauora Levels 5 and 6 unit standards are currently being reviewed to align the outcomes of the standards with the newly listed New Zealand qualifications. If you would like further information in regards to the unit standards, please contact Māori Qualification Services.
