Overview

Manu Taiko – Toro Parirau (Kaupae 4) [Ref: 2426]

New Zealand Certificate in Māori Governance (Level 4)

This qualification is intended for those who seek or have some previous experience working in a te ao Māori context and/or governance, and are seeking a formal Māori governance qualification at first level management.

Graduates of this qualification will benefit entities by using their skills and knowledge based on kotahitanga, whanaungatanga, kaitiakitanga, te pono me te tika and rangatiratanga to participate in Māori governance activities and/or undertake governance roles to advance the cultural, educational and economic aspirations of their whānau, hapū, iwi, hapori. Graduates will be capable of working at first level management with some supervision.

Manu Taiko – Hoka Rangi (Kaupae 6) [Ref: 2427]

New Zealand Diploma in Māori Governance (Level 6)

This qualification is targeted at people who have previous experience working in governance or trustee roles and who seek to further their management skills to progress the cultural, educational and economic aspirations of whānau, hapū, iwi.

Graduates of this qualification will benefit entities by leading and managing the matāpono: kotahitanga, whanaungatanga, kaitiakitanga, te pono me te tika and rangatiratanga for the benefit of current and future generations of whānau, hapū, iwi. Graduates will be capable of working independently at a management level.

Education Pathways

These qualifications may lead to further study at higher levels in Management, Resource Management, or Iwi Environmental Management.

Career Opportunities

These qualifications provide a pathway for graduates to work in a variety of positions in a governance context with an emphasis on Māori governance which explicitly recognises those things most valued by Māori, while ensuring the standard requirements of governance are also met, or exceeded.

Graduates of the **certificate** will have the transferable skills and knowledge to contribute to the development of whānau, hapū, iwi, and community, and to act effectively across a range of roles including the following:

- Administrator
- Secretary, Treasurer, or Trust Chair
- Trustee or Committee member

Graduates of the **diploma** will have the transferable skills and knowledge to develop capability and capacity to protect, maintain, and enrich mātauranga taonga tuku iho for whānau, hapū, iwi, and hapori for future and current generations, and to act in a range of roles including the following:

- Administrative Leader
- Business, Funds or Property Manager
- Board Chair
- Hapū/Iwi advisor or representative.
- Elected government representative
- Policy Analyst
