Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Te Kaupae 1) [Ref: 3043]

New Zealand Certificate in Te Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Level 1)

This foundation qualification is intended for learners who have minimal command of Te Reo, as an additional language. It is also intended for those who have a desire to contribute positively to the development of Te Reo kia tika, kia rere, kia Māori, or who have a personal and/or professional interest in Te Reo.

Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Te Kaupae 2) [Ref: 3044]

New Zealand Certificate in Te Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Level 2)

This qualification is intended for learners who have a basic understanding and ability in the use of Te Reo. It is also for those who have a desire to contribute positively to the development of Te Reo kia tika, kia rere, kia Māori, or have a personal and/or professional interest in Te Reo.

Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Te Kaupae 3) [Ref: 3045]

New Zealand Certificate in Te Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Level 3)

This qualification is intended for learners who have an intermediate-level understanding of, and ability in the use of, Te Reo. It is also intended for those who have a desire to contribute positively to the development of Te Reo kia tika, kia rere, kia Māori, or have a personal and/or professional interest in Te Reo.

Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Te Kaupae 4) [Ref: 3046]

New Zealand Certificate in Te Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Level 4)

This qualification is intended for learners who have an advanced-intermediate level of understanding and ability in the use of Te Reo. It is also intended for those who have a desire to contribute positively to the development of, or have a personal and/or professional interest in Te Reo.

Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Rumaki) (Te Kaupae 5) [Ref: 3047]

New Zealand Certificate in Te Reo (Rumaki) (Level 5)

This qualification is intended for emerging speakers of Te Reo



who have an advanced understanding, and ability in the use of, Te Reo kia tika, kia rere, kia Māori. Graduates will be able to communicate independently in Te Reo and express ideas and theories in a wide range of familiar and some less familiar situations with fluency and flexibility. In addition to the acquisition of the language, graduates will have developed technical knowledge in Te Reo.

Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Rumaki) (Te Kaupae 6) [Ref: 3049]

New Zealand Certificate in Te Reo (Rumaki) (Level 6)

This qualification is intended for competent speakers of Te Reo who have a desire to contribute positively to the development of, or have a personal and/or professional interest in, Te Reo. In addition to the acquisition of the language, graduates will have developed technical knowledge in Te Reo.

- roles within government and private sectors as administrators, junior policy analysts, liaison, cultural advisors, educator/teacher – general and Te Reo; Kaiawhina, Kaiarahi i Te Reo in Kohanga Reo, Kura Kaupapa Māori, primary schools, Māori radio trainees, health educators support workers, tour guides, hospitality positions, politics – hospital boards, regional boards, local council, and in parliament, workers in museums and within foreign embassies in New Zealand or overseas.
