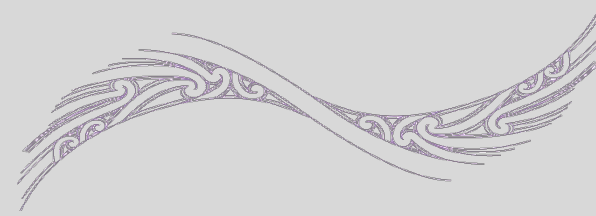

Overview

New Zealand Certificate in Whānau Ora (Level 3) [Ref: 2877]

This qualification is for people who wish to work with Māori and whānau in the development of a whānau-centred approach that supports whānau wellbeing. The purpose of this qualification is to provide graduates with a range of knowledge, skills and processes in mātauranga Māori wellbeing approaches that can be applied in whānau ora contexts. Graduates of this qualification will be able to under supervision apply knowledge of Māori philosophies and theories of Māori wellbeing.

New Zealand Certificate in Whānau Ora (Level 4) [Ref: 2878]

This qualification is for people who wish to work with Māori and whānau in the development of a whānau-centred approach that supports whānau wellbeing. The purpose of this qualification is to provide graduates with a range of knowledge, skills and experiences in mātauranga Māori wellbeing approaches. Graduates of this qualification will be able to under limited supervision apply knowledge of Māori philosophies and theories of Māori wellbeing for a range of whānau ora contexts.

New Zealand Diploma in Whānau Ora (Level 5) [Ref: 2879]

This qualification is for people who wish to work with Māori and whānau in the development of a whānau-centred approach that supports whānau wellbeing. The purpose of this qualification is to provide graduates with in-depth knowledge, skills and experiences in mātauranga Māori wellbeing approaches for whānau ora contexts. Graduates of this qualification will be able to independently apply knowledge of Māori philosophies and theories of Māori wellbeing across a range of whānau ora contexts.

These qualifications provide a pathway for those seeking to work effectively in Māori communities amongst whānau, hapū, and/or iwi.

Graduates will have the transferrable skills and knowledge to:

- Whakamana Māori and whānau to make decisions for their own oranga
- Develop and manage whānau, hapū, iwi and/or hāpori projects and/or initiatives in the care and development of their own base assets such as the moana, whenua, and ngahere.
