## Level 1 Cook Islands Māori 2016

#### Part A: Commentary

To be awarded Achievement with Merit or Achievement with Excellence, candidates needed to provide sufficient evidence to demonstrate clear or thorough understanding. If answers are formed using sentences directly copied from the texts, or provided answers using only his or her own opinions/ideas that were not given in the passage, they were not awarded with higher grades.

### **90873: Demonstrate understanding of a variety of spoken Cook Islands Māori texts on areas of most immediate relevance**

### **90876: Demonstrate understanding of a variety of written/visual Cook Islands Māori texts on areas of most immediate relevance**

Candidates who were awarded **Achievement** commonly:

- understood the key ideas of the text but were not able to develop detailed answers
- attempted only some of the questions
- answered what was required by the question, but not in any depth
- provided some responses which were direct quotations from the text.

No candidates were assessed as **Not Achieved** in 2016.

Candidates who were awarded **Achievement with Merit** commonly:

- selected relevant information, ideas, and opinions from the text which showed clear understanding of the texts

- were able to develop an explanatory answer without indicating a grasp of fine detail and nuance.

Candidates who were awarded **Achievement with Excellence** commonly:

- understood the questions and supplied sufficient details, substantial development and justification within their answers
- selected and expanded on, with supporting detail, relevant information, ideas, and opinions from the text
- understood the implied meanings or conclusions within the text.
