<b>Purpose</b>	People accredited with this unit standard are able to explain: how tikanga has impacted the hauora of whānau in the home in traditional, contemporary and evolving contexts.

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### Guidance Information

- Definitions of Māori words will be those relevant and in common usage in a Hauora context and/or local iwi or hapū.
- Definitions  
*Contemporary* – post-1945.  
*Hauora* refers to appropriate practices associated with the holistic wellbeing of an individual as a member of a whānau, hapū, and iwi.  
*Tikanga* refers to Maori values, proverbs and practices exercised by Māori in their daily lives. These reflect the concepts upon which they are based and provide guidelines for appropriate behaviour and conduct in Māori society. They also prescribe consequences for any breaches or when tikanga is not followed. They can be particular to rohe, iwi, hapū, whānau, marae or hāpori.  
*Traditional* – pre-1945.
- The context of inquiries is limited to local rohe or takiwā. Where local rohe are also occupied by Māori with other iwi or hapū affiliations, the tangata whenua or mana whenua view takes precedence. However, these alternative perspectives should be encouraged in order to enrich and enhance understanding of key hauora concepts.
- Descriptions and explanations can be presented in a number of ways that may include but are not limited to; oral presentations, visual presentations, written presentations, whakaari, waiata, and haka.
- All sources of information must be referenced.

- 3.2 Explanation describes the impact tikanga had on whānau in the home in contemporary times.
