*Intermediate terrain* is terrain and runs classified as blue at a snowsport area.

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## Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Demonstrate intermediate snowboard skills on blue terrain at a snowsport area.

### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Demonstrate linked turns of different sizes and shapes on both edges.

- 1.2 Control speed using the shape of the turn and adapt turn-shape for changes in terrain.
- 1.3 Demonstrate strong edged turns using a blend of steering, edging, and pressure control.
- 1.4 Demonstrate medium and long radius strong edged turns through the fall line.
- 1.5 Ride forwards and switch with a balanced stance.
